CCPT 102: CHILD-CENTERED PLAY THERAPY PRACTICE & APPLICATION

This is a three-day, advanced training on the practice and application of Child-Centered Play Therapy (CCPT). This intensive training builds upon foundational CCPT skills by addressing advanced topics in CCPT. Participants must have completed CCPT 101 or an equivalent course to register.

TRAINING DESCRIPTION

This training covers: understanding child development, the CCPT process (relational disruptions and enacting conditions), themes in CCPT, advanced limit-setting, specific presenting problems/populations, parent consultation, advocacy, general research findings, and opportunities to apply and practice CCPT skills. The workshop includes a micro-practicum session and requires each participant to conduct and record a CCPT session with a child aged 3–10 before the workshop.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

By the end of this training, participants will be able to:

- Describe how child development impacts play therapy.
- Distinguish between play behaviors and play themes.
- Demonstrate when and how to use limit-setting and choice-giving from a child-centered perspective.
- Demonstrate CCPT skills and attitudes.
- Cite and access research findings on the effectiveness of CCPT.
- Articulate the change process for various presenting problems.
- Integrate feedback into their CCPT practice.

is a counselor educator and advanced play therapist specializing in multicultural counseling, neurodiversity, and immigrant populations, with extensive clinical and research experience.

MEET THE SPEAKER

Dr. Regine Chung, LMHC, RPT™, RP, CAS, is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Mental Health Counseling at Niagara University in Lewiston, NY. She earned her Ph.D. in Counselor Education from the University of North Texas, specializing in play therapy and multicultural counseling. Dr. Chung has presented at international, regional, and local play therapy conferences in the U.S. and is an approved trainer and supervisor by the Center for Play Therapy at UNT. While she provides training and supervision, certification in Child-Centered Play Therapy, Child-Centered Group Play Therapy, and Child-Parent Relationship Therapy is granted by the Center for Play Therapy.

Dr. Chung has extensive clinical and supervisory experience working with clients across the lifespan and with a range of neurodevelopmental needs. As the former Assistant Director of Center for Play Therapy, she provided play therapy services in various settings, including university community clinics, a domestic violence agency, and general and special education environments. She currently provides play therapy, parent consultation, and clinical supervision in private practice.

Dr. Chung is the author of several peer-reviewed articles and book chapters on multicultural issues and play therapy. Her play therapy research has received multiple accolades, including the Association of Child and Adolescent Counseling Research Grant, the Dan E. Homeyer Play Therapy Research Grant Award, and the Association for Play Therapy Student Research Award. Her current research focuses on multicultural issues in counseling, play therapy, neurodiversity, and immigrant populations, aiming to improve treatment effectiveness and accessibility.

*Attainment of all levels of CCPT, CCGPT, and CPRT-Level 2 and Level 3 Certification requires a mental health license. Individuals who do not have mental health licenses or are not currently pursuing mental health licensure are eligible to complete CCPT 101 and CPRT 101. Individuals without mental health licenses are eligible to attain certification as a Level 1-Certified CPRT Associate/Parent Educator. Play therapy CE credit is only available for mental health professionals or full-time graduate students in the mental health field.

[^]The Center for Play Therapy offers international CCPT, CCPT-S, CCGPT, CCGPT-S, CPRT, and CPRT-S certifications for mental health professionals working in other countries. The Center for Play Therapy ensures that internationally certified CCPT, CCGPT, and CPRT therapists and supervisors are knowledgeable and experienced in CCPT, CCGPT, and CPRT, respectively; however, we do not ensure that international therapists are licensed in their field of study. The designation for international certification is Certified I-CCPT, Certified I-CCPT-S, Certified I-CCGPT, Certified CCGPT-S, Certified I-CPRT, and Certified I-CPRT-S.
